The No Show rate for February was 21%. When considering both the no show rate and the cancellation rate, this figure is 46%.

VIII: AOD UTILIZATION REVIEW

There are currently no AOD groups active within the agency. AOD clients continue to be seen on an individual basis following the agency's program.

IX: INVOLUNTARY TERMINATIONS

No involuntary terminations were conducted during the month of February 2007.

X: PROFESSIONAL STAFF ORGANIZATION

All clinicians maintain current licensure requirements.

XI: REVIEW OF WAITING LIST

There were a total of 83 new clients seen in the month of February. Seventy-two percent of these new clients were from Fairfield County. The total number of clients seen in the month of February was 715.

The average time between phone intake and the first appointment time offered was 22.42 days. The average time between phone intake and completion of intakes for new clients was 32.62 days. The agency strives to see new clients within 30 days of initial contact.

XII: REVIEW OF SERVICES UNDER CONTRACT

Currently no services are provided under contract to this agency.

XIII: FOCUSED REVIEW AREA

The focused area of review for February was to review accessibility, availability, and appropriateness of services for persons who speak a language other than English or have a handicapping condition. Staff completed an email survey regarding any accessibility, availability, and appropriateness of service issues for existing or potential clients and visitors.

There were fifteen responses to the email survey. Four responses were in regards to having no awareness of any client accessibility issues. Seven responses were in regards to having clients or being aware of clients with physical limitations. The agency currently responds to clients who cannot climb steps due to physical limitations by utilizing first floor offices for scheduled appointments. One therapist reported that a county children services worker reported to her that a foster parent said the agency did not meet their physical needs; however the client was seen in a downstairs office, so the foster parent could be consulted during sessions. A transporter also inquired with the office regarding ramps in the sidewalk that would ease access to and from the street. The remaining three responses were regarding clients who do not speak English or were deaf in the agency's Franklin County office. We arranged for an interpreter for one case, who in the end did not show up for the first appointment and the other cases were referred to Netcare.

Interpretation services are available by students at Ohio University; the students determine reasonable fees. The agency would contact the department chair in the event that services were requested and the need would be posted on an open board in the language department so that students could contact us directly. Services may be available

in the following languages French, Spanish, German, Italian, Russian, Spanish, Chinese, Indonesian, Japanese, and Swahili.

XIV: RESPONSE TO LAST MONTHS FOCUS REVIEW

There was no response to last months focus review.

XV: CLIENT RIGHTS AND GRIEVANCES

There were no client grievances filed for the month of February.

XVI: TREATMENT OUTCOMES REPORTING

The “Outcome Review” for this month focused on assessing adolescents accepting responsibility for their actions in the opinions of the providers and workers involved with them.

The outcome item used to review this issue is located on the Ohio Mental Health Consumers Outcomes System Child Worker Form W. The question answered by the provider is “Please circle the number corresponding to the designated youth’s current level of functioning in each area.--19. Accepting responsibility for actions”

Worker reports were reviewed using the ODMH Data Mart for all years reported (2005-2007). The scores range from 0-4 (0 extreme trouble, 1 quite a few troubles, 2 some trouble, 3 OK, 4 doing very well).

The means were 1.87 (2005), 1.88 (2006) and 2.04 (2007). Please see the attached graph “Youth Accepting Responsibility—Worker Outcome” for a comparison of the “Intake Score” and the “Post Scores” for each of these three time frames. As can be seen in the graph, in one year (2006), treatment seemed to actually decrease the perception that the youth accepts responsibility for their actions. This may be a function of the fact that the vast majority of cases did not have a “post” score, and therefore perhaps only those cases that were most problematic were engaged in treatment long enough to have a post measure administered. When comparing intake scores to all other scores, there were no statistically significant differences ($p=.853$). This suggests that treatment does not impact the therapist’s perception of the youth’s ability to accept responsibility for their actions. Because of the relatively small comparative “post” group, this conclusion should be viewed with a great deal of caution.

As with all data derived from the data mart, the results should be viewed with caution due to inconsistent sample sizes in each reporting period as well as the lack of external validation of the data scales.

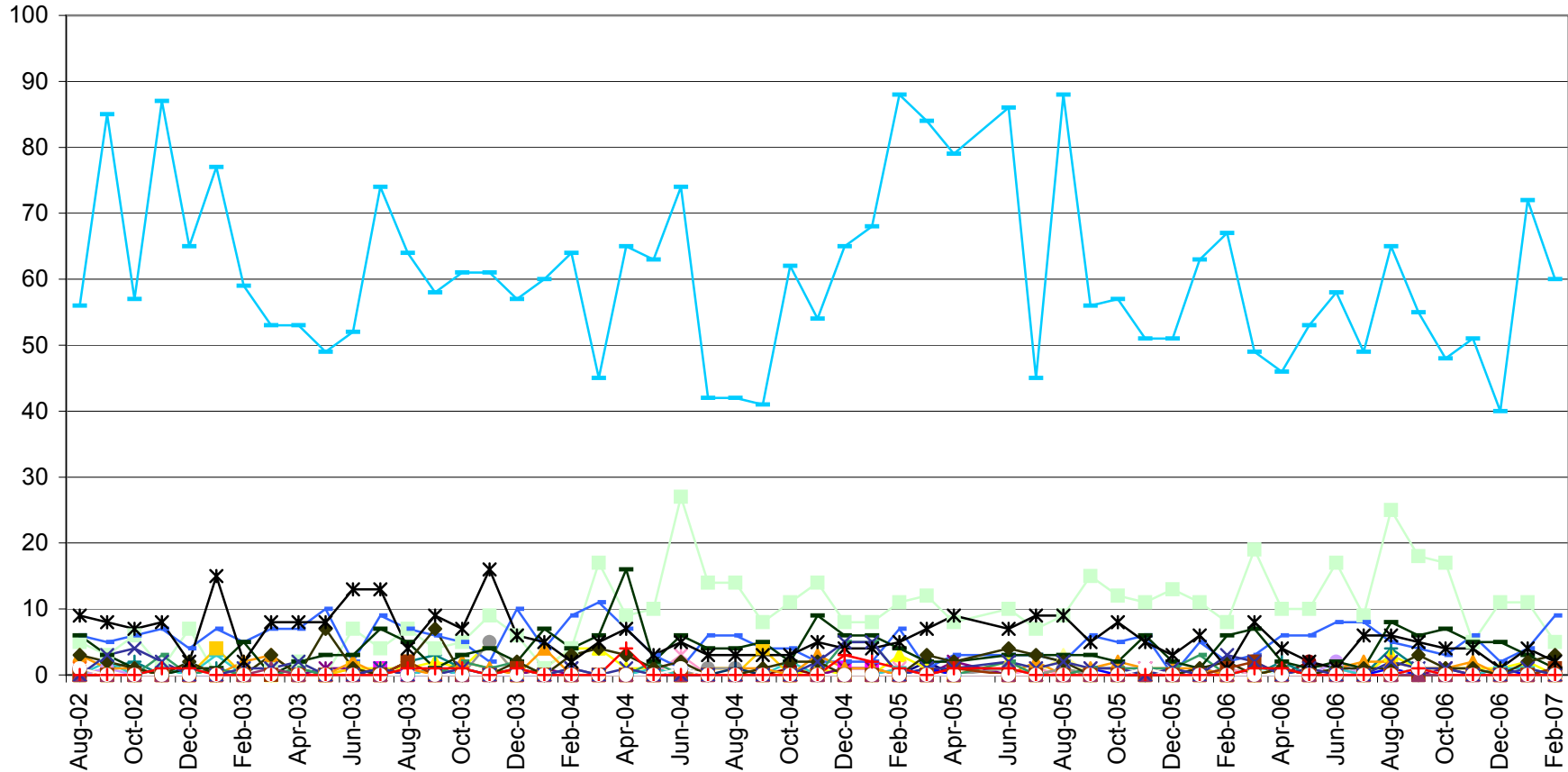

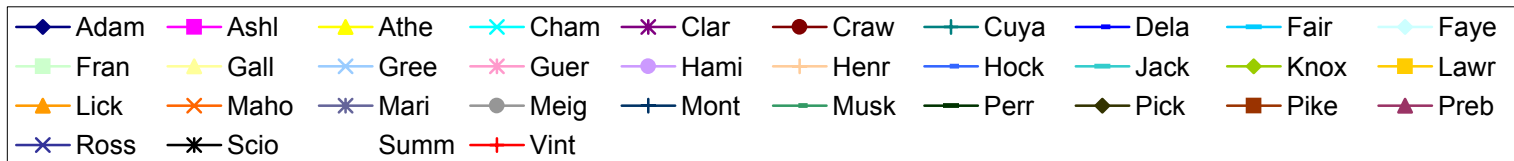

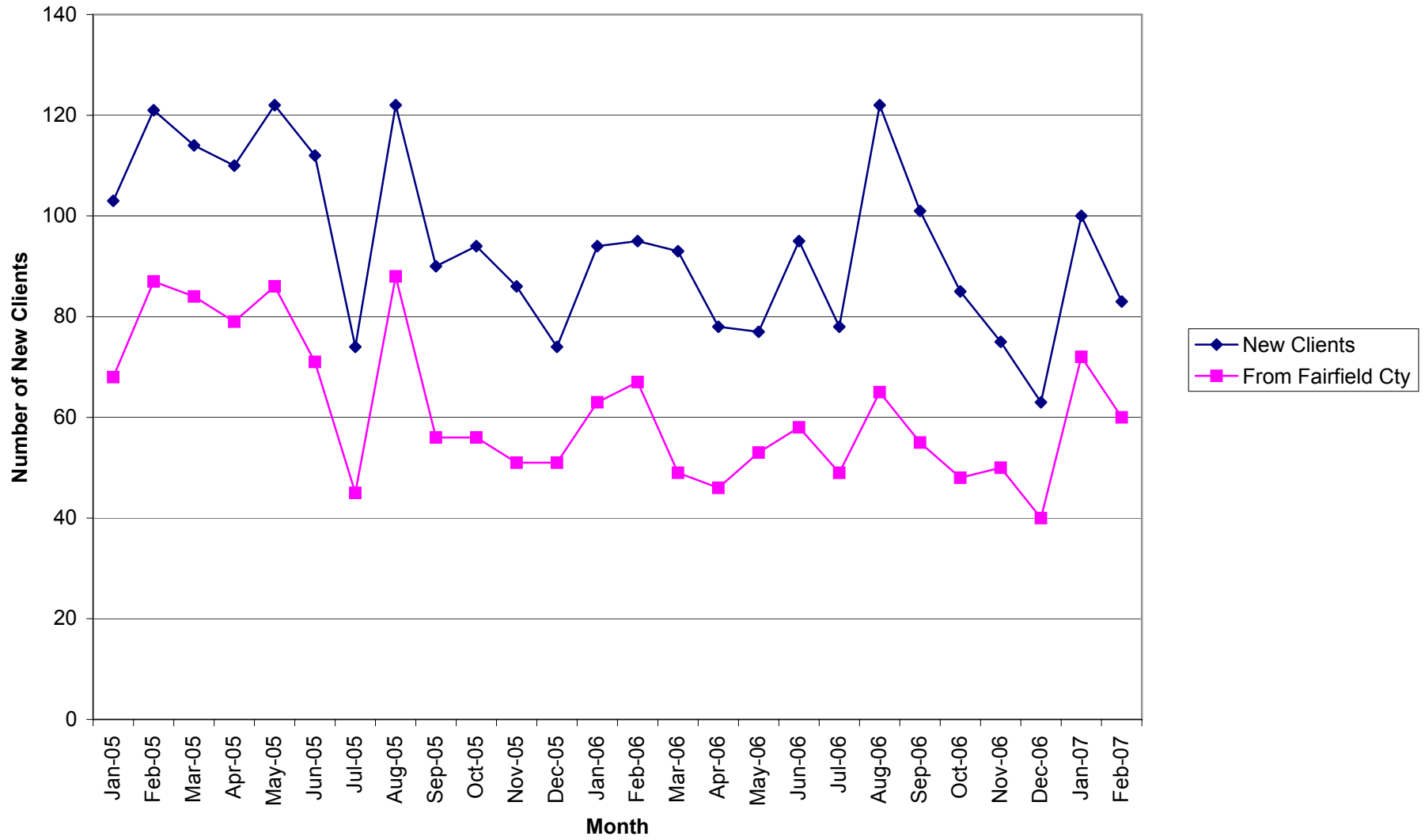
Number of Intakes by County



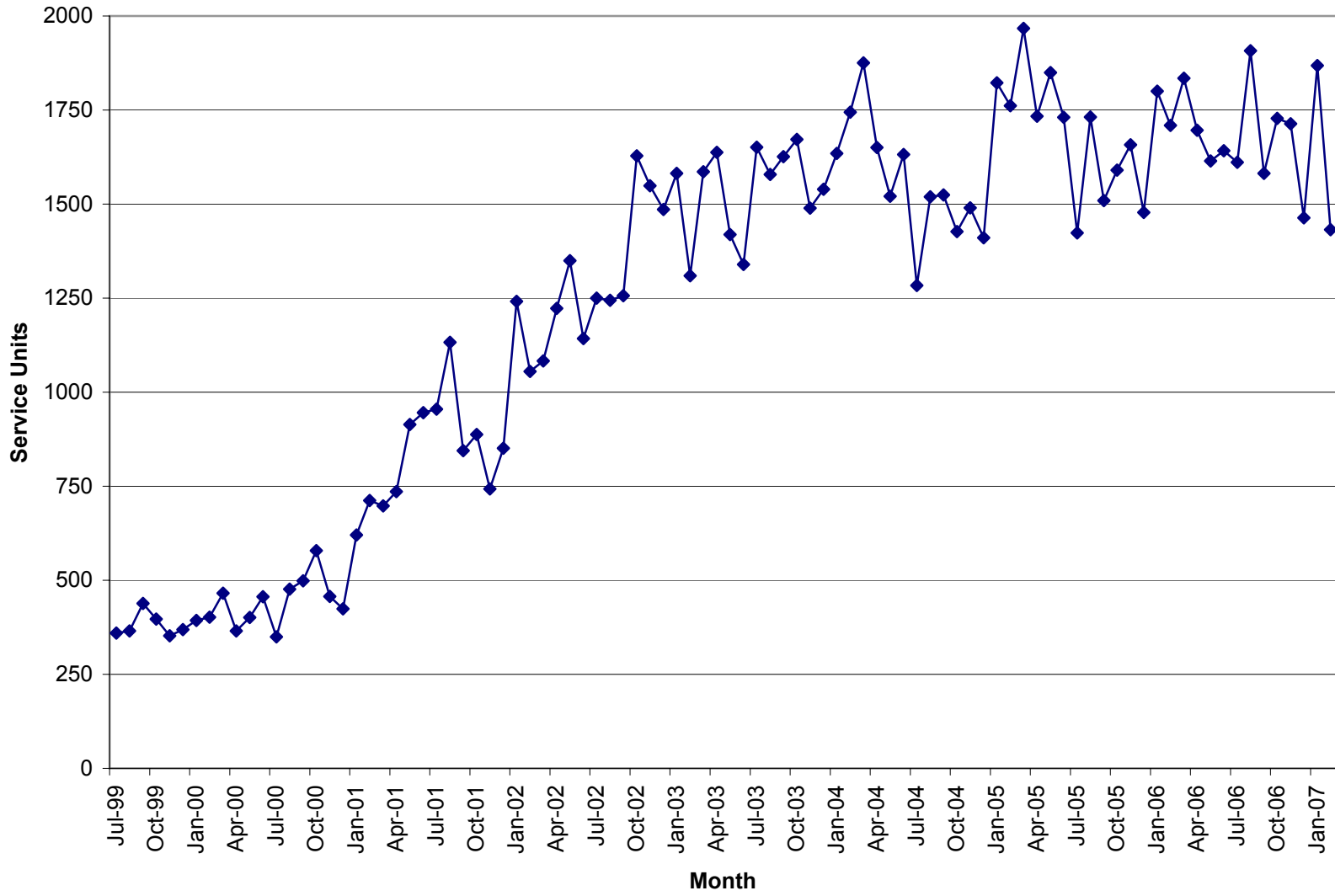

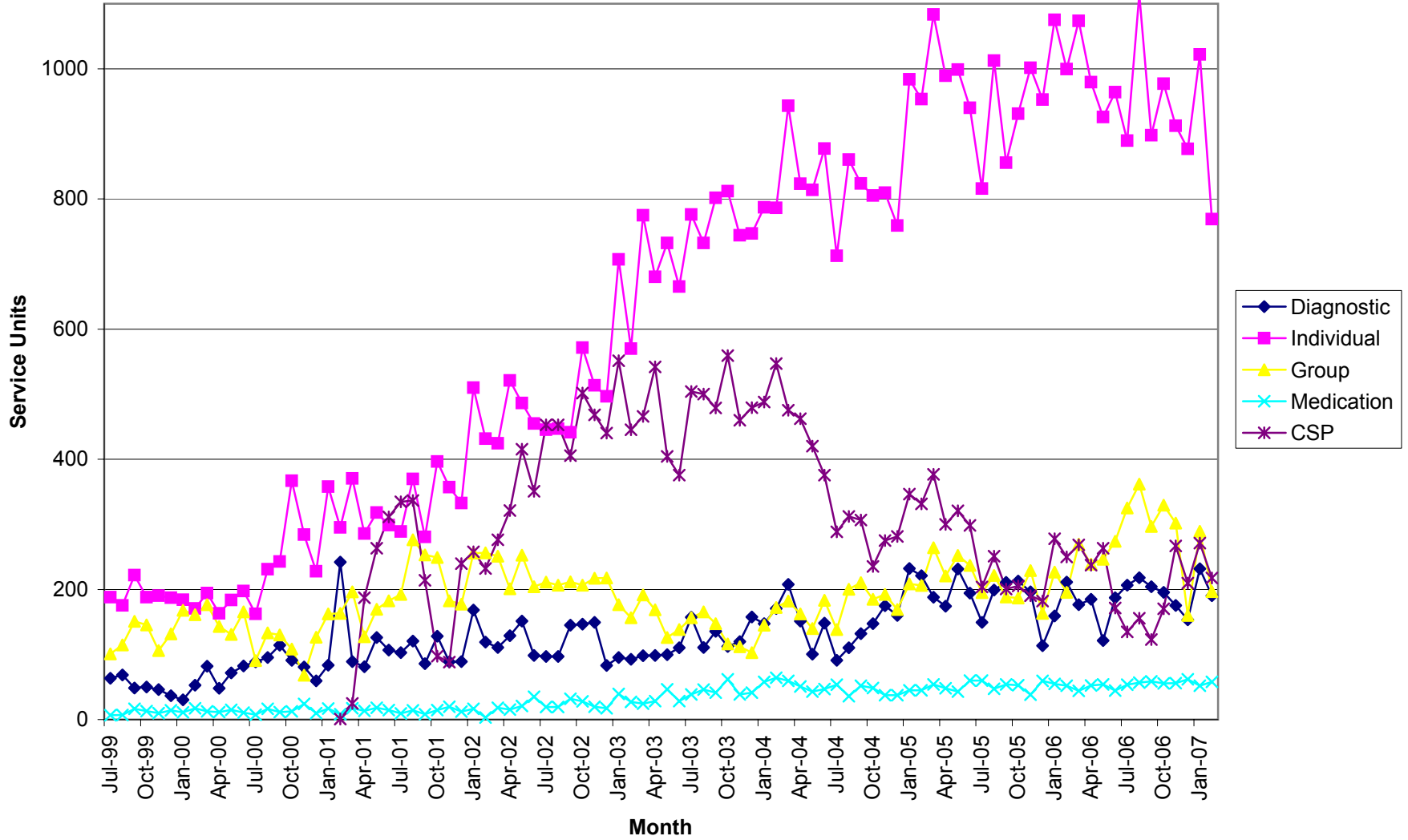
New Clients



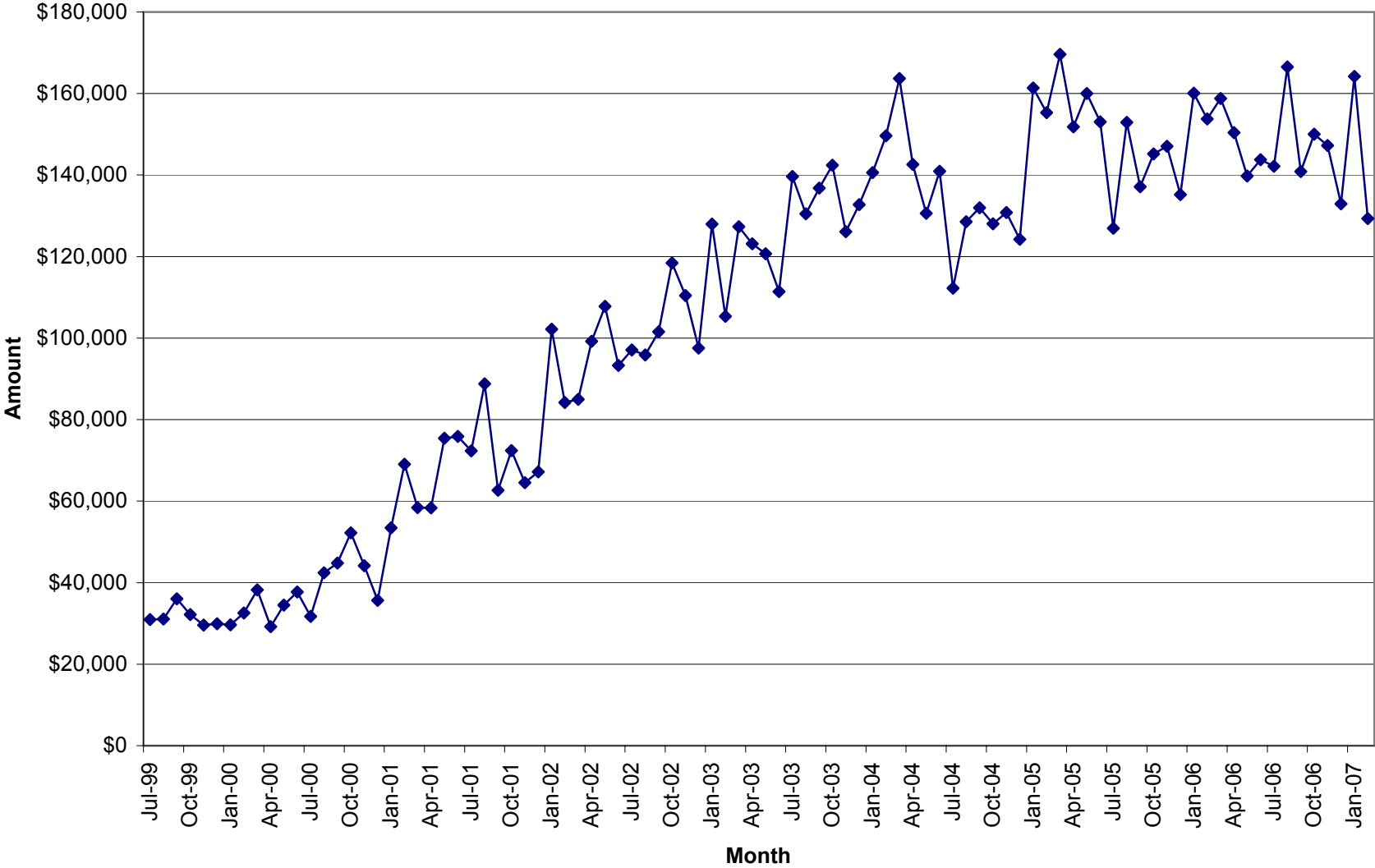
Total Units of Service
