I: MAJOR UNUSUAL INCIDENTS

There were three major unusual incidents for the month of March. The first incident occurred on 2/26/2007. Client #06052502 expressed ongoing suicidal ideations during a regularly scheduled session. The therapist attempted to have the client contract for safety; however the client abruptly left the appointment. The Logan Police and Tri-County Crisis Intervention were contacted and provided with contact information for the client. The staff at Tri-County made contact with the client and were able to obtain a verbal safety contract from the client and reassurances from the client's family that the client would remain with them until the next day. The client contacted the therapist on 02/27/2007 and indicated that the suicidal ideations had passed. The client was seen on 03/07/2007 by Jennifer Kennedy. The incident was reported to the Fairfield County ADAMH Board, the report was late due to the incident not being reported until 3/9/2007.

The second incident occurred on 03/09/2007. Client #02031801 expressed homicidal and suicidal ideations to the staff psychiatrist. The Lancaster Police were called to the agency. The client was voluntarily taken to Fairfield Medical Center to be evaluated by emergency services staff. The client was not admitted to the hospital, so the client was monitored by case management staff until the next appoint with her therapist. The client was seen by Marlies Parikian on 03/16/2007. The incident was reported to the Fairfield County ADAMH Board.

The third incident occurred on 03/12/2007. Client #07011751 expressed suicidal ideations to staff and refused to contract for safety before fleeing the agency. A referral was made to Fairfield Medical Center, a pink slip was issued, and Lancaster Police were dispatched to locate the client. The client was not hospitalized or evaluated at Fairfield



Medical Center, the client returned to the agency on 3/13/2007 and was seen by Jennifer Kennedy. The incident was reported to the Fairfield County ADAMH Board.

II: ABUSE AND NEGLECT AND DUTY TO WARN

The agency made nine reports to Children Services during the month of March.

The client was scheduled to be seen multiple times within the following two-week period however; the client was incarcerated after leaving the hospital so appointments with agency staff could not be kept.

Sixteen percent of the clinicians failed to meet the 95% threshold for the record review.

Errors found during reviews and the percentage of records reviewed are as follows:

- Forty-four percent of the records reviewed were missing a copy of the current medical card.
- Signatures were missing on some forms in the chart for 4% of the clinicians.
- In four percent of the records reviewed there was at least one session recorded that did not match the billing record.
- Twenty-four percent of the records reviewed had an Individual Service Plan on the chart that needed to be updated.
- Thirty-six percent of the records were missing case notes for billed services.
- Eight percent had not completed the physical health assessment.
- Sixteen percent of the records reviewed were missing forms.

- Twelve percent of the records reviewed for peer review showed that the clinician's are not coordinating care with other agency providers (case managers and the psychiatrist).
- Sixteen percent of the records indicated that treatment was not consistent with the client's diagnosis.

XI: REVIEW OF WAITING LIST

There were a total of 71 new clients seen in the month of March. Sixty-nine percent of these new clients were from Fairfield County. The total number of clients seen in the month of March was 840.

The average time between phone intake and the first appointment time offered was 26.85 days. The average time between phone intake and the time that the client was actually seen for new clients was 34.05 days. The agency strives to see new clients within 30 days of initial contact.

XII: REVIEW OF SERVICES UNDER CONTRACT

Currently no services are provided under contract to this agency.

XIII: FOCUSED REVIEW AREA

The focused area of review for March is to forward the quarterly report to the Board, this will be done when it is completed.

XIV: RESPONSE TO LAST MONTHS FOCUS REVIEW

There was no response to last months focus review.

XV: CLIENT RIGHTS AND GRIEVANCES

There were no client grievances filed for the month of March.

XVI: TREATMENT OUTCOMES REPORTING

The “Outcome Review” for this month focused on assessing parents reporting of adolescent client’s problem severity at standard intervals in treatment.

The questions for this measure come from the Ohio Mental Health Consumer Outcomes System Ohio Youth Problem, Functioning, and Satisfaction Scales. Form P asks parents to rate “the degree to which your child’s problems affect his or her current ability in everyday activities. Consider your child’s current level of functioning.”

1. Getting along with friends
2. Getting along with family
3. Dating or developing relationships with boyfriends or girlfriends
4. Getting along with adults outside the family (teachers, principal)
5. Keeping neat and clean, looking good
6. Caring for health needs and keeping good health habits (taking medicines or brushing teeth)
7. Controlling emotions and staying out of trouble
8. Being motivated and finishing projects
9. Participating in hobbies (baseball cards, coins, stamps, art)
10. Participating in recreational activities (sports, swimming, bike riding)
11. Completing household chores (cleaning room, other chores)
12. Attending school and getting passing grades in school
13. Learning skills that will be useful for future jobs
14. Feeling good about self
15. Thinking clearly and making good decisions
16. Concentrating, paying attention, and completing tasks
17. Earning money and learning how to use money wisely
18. Doing things without supervision or restrictions
19. Accepting responsibility for actions
20. Ability to express feelings

Parent reports were reviewed using the ODMH Data Mart for all years reported (FY2007). The scale ranges from 0-100 (0-9 no significant problems, 10-19 low level of problems, 20-36 moderate level of problems, 37-52 intense problems, 53-100 very intense problems).

At 30 days, the mean was 26.84, 90 days, the mean was 25.25, 180 days, the mean was 16.60, 270 days, the mean was 21.00, 1 year, and the mean was 22.33. The decrease in the mean score showed improvement in problems during the first 180 days in service.

However, clients who are in service over 180 days tend to not evidence improvement in their overall functioning. This could be due to a small sample of clients who are not improving with the current treatment regime, or it could reflect greater pathology for persons who are seen for a greater length of time. Graphs of the information obtained from the ODMH Data Mart follow this report.

As with all data derived from the data mart, the results should be viewed with caution due to inconsistent sample sizes in each reporting period as well as the lack of external validation of the data scales.

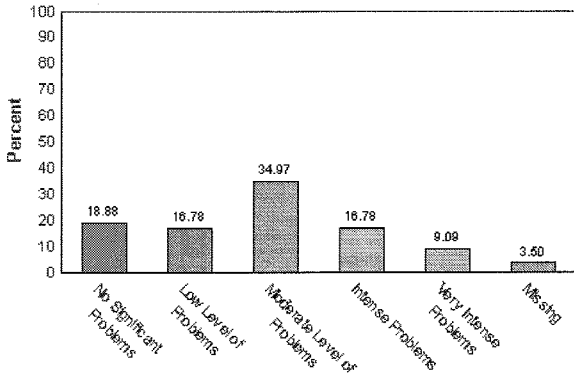

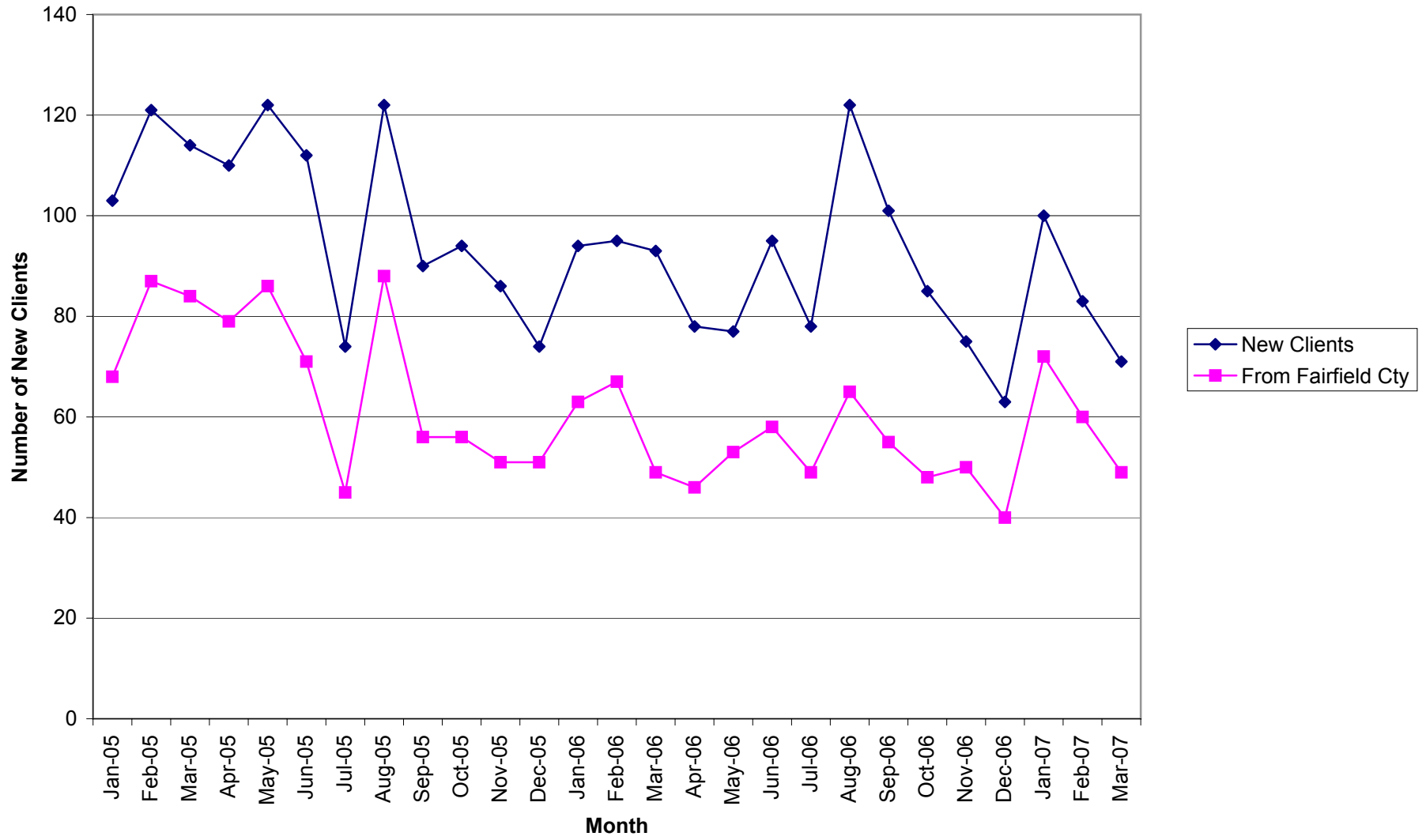
Number of Intakes by County



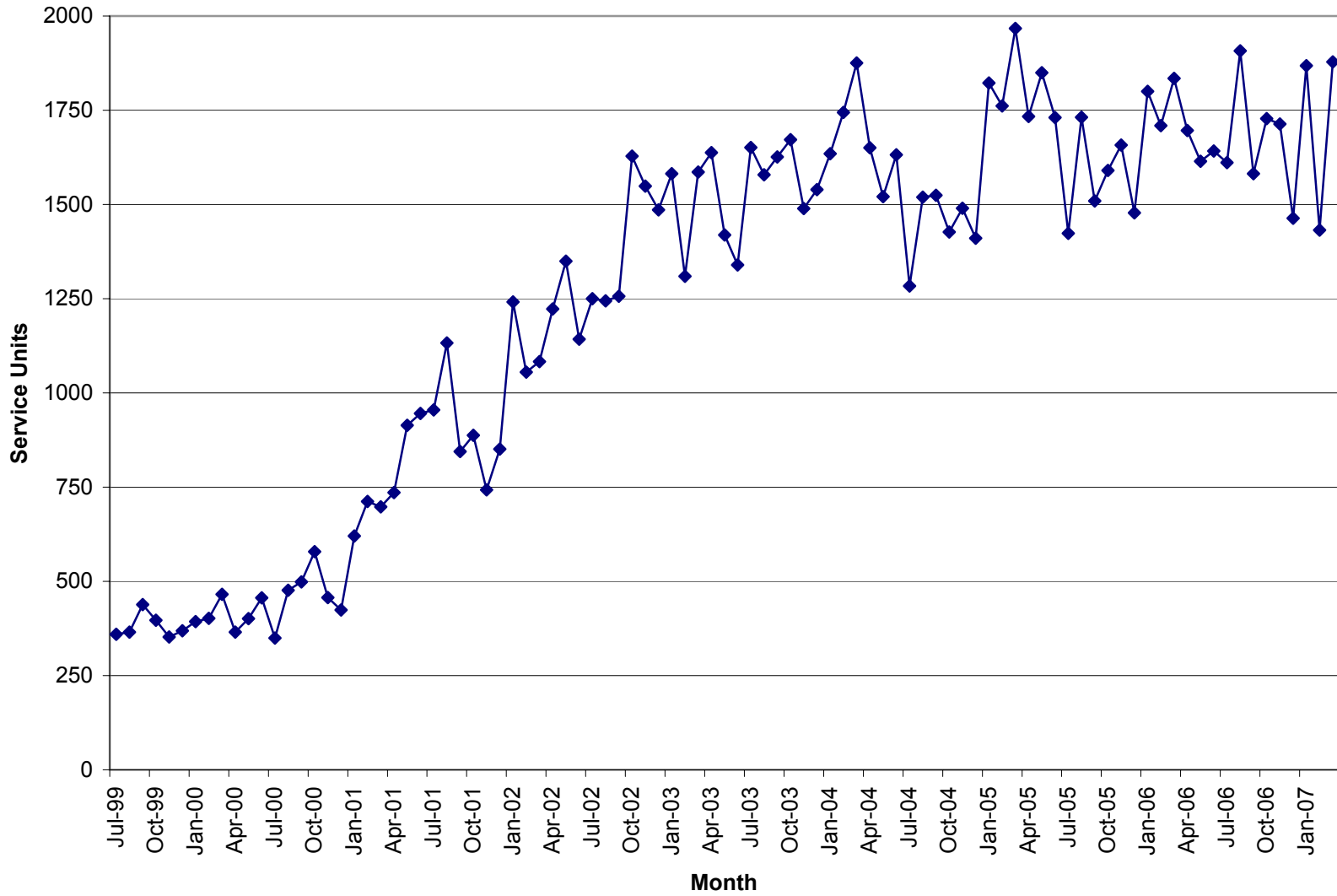
